

Fellowship in Law Librarianship

The University of Arizona School of Information Resources and Library Science (SIRLS) and the Cracchiolo Law Library of the James E. Rogers College of Law offer a two-year fellowship in law librarianship for lawyers seeking to become law librarians.

The successful applicant will work twenty hours per week in the Law Library while pursuing an M.A. in Information Resources and Library Science. The salary is \$11,000 (twelve-month) year (based on an annual salary of \$22,000 prorated at .50 FTE/20 hours per week). Benefits and tuition reduction are included.

There is a two-step application process for admission:

- Application for Admission to Graduate Study
- Written Statement of Introduction
- Official Transcript from each college or university attended
- Resume of educational and work experience
- Two letters of recommendation

- **Fellowship Application**

-Resume and Letter of Interest must be attached electronically with online application. Letter of Interest should describe interest in law librarianship.

University of Arizona Employment Requirements include the following:

Arizona Board of Regents Minimum Qualifications

- J.D. degree from an ABA-accredited law school (awarded before fellowship begins).
- Admission to the University of Arizona School of Information Resources and Library Science. (It is critical that applicants fully follow the SIRLS application process).

Preferred Qualifications

-Preference given to students with Spanish language skills.

Duties and Responsibilities

- Assist law librarians in providing reference and research services to library patrons
- The first year will focus on technical and access services
- The second year will focus on public services
