Following are key details pertinent to this Rehnquist Center program.

Security Protocol and Entry Guidelines

- Please arrive early. Doors to the Ares Auditorium will open by 2:30.
- Those with confirmed reservations for the Ares Auditorium must check in first at the Lewis and Roca Lobby at *Arizona Law*.
- Bring the admission ticket that was sent with the reservation confirmation.
- University Student Photo ID in the same name as that on the confirmation ticket is required.
- Each person entering the Ares Auditorium must go through security.
- No backpacks, purses, bags, laptops, or electronic equipment allowed (except cell phones, which must be turned OFF). There will not be a secured storage area for your belongings, so please make your own arrangements.
- Please note that no food or drink will be allowed.

Late Seating

- Students with confirmed reservations should be checked in and seated in the Auditorium by 2:50 p.m. At that time, all open seats will be filled by waiting University students on a first-come, first-served.
- Students wishing to take advantage of late seating must show a University Student Photo ID, must go through security, and must meet the last two requirements above.
