At this conference scholars from law and other disciplines in the social sciences will present their ideas on diverse aspects of public policy related to children. Throughout the conference, art work by foster children will be on display, through the Families for Kids Program, sponsored by the W.K. Kellogg Foundation Pima County Project. In addition, poetry and writings by juveniles in detention will be on display. Saturday's lunchtime presentations will focus on these projects.

This conference is sponsored by the James E. Rogers Program on Law, Philosophy, and Social Inquiry which is a joint program of the College of Law and the Departments of Anthropology, Philosophy, Psychology, and Sociology at the University of Arizona. The program engages participants in a multi-disciplinary exchange of ideas and methodologies in an ongoing effort to integrate the various disciplines in a sustained examination of issues of public importance.
